

Ordinance No. 32

An Ordinance to govern the running at large of horses, Mules, Cattle, goats, sheep or swine within the limits of the Town of Eckley, Colorado.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Eckley, Colorado.

Sec. 1. That it shall be unlawful for horses, Mules, cattle, goats, sheep, or swine to run at large within the corporate limits of the town of Eckley, Colo. The owner or owners of any such stock who shall suffer the same to run at large in said corporate limits, shall for each offense be fined not less than one dollar, nor more than five dollars, plus the costs of the town Marshall of impounding the same, and every day or part of a day that such stock is permitted to run at large shall constitute a separate offense, and the same fine shall be imposed.

Sec. 2, It is further provided that if any horses, mules, cattle, goats, sheep, or swine be found running at large within the corporate limits of the town of Eckley Colo, that they shall be impounded and taken care of by the town Marshall who shall, if not claimed within forty-eight hours, make out a written description of said stock, setting forth all marks and brands apparent, or other marks of identity, such as color, age, or size, and shall post notices, one on the pound, one in the office of the Police Magistrate, and one at the post office, and shall place same upon record in the estray books, and said stock shall be dealt with according to the statutory laws of Colorado.

Sec. 3, It is further provided that the Marshall shall be allowed One Dollar for every such animal so impounded if claimed within forty-eight hours, together with all costs of keeping.

Sec. 4, This ordinance shall take effect upon the expiration of five days from and after one publication thereof in the Eckley Tribune of Eckley Colo, after its passage and aproval,
